

No Turkeys for Thanksgiving, Oh My!



Turkeys are selling for record prices ahead of this year's Thanksgiving holiday as a resurgence of the Avian bird flu decimates turkey flocks across the United States. Millions of turkeys have been killed in recent weeks. As a result, inventories are at historic low levels and prices are 80% above pre-pandemic costs. St. Vincent has been pre-warned by our usual suppliers of free Thanksgiving turkeys that we should not expect to receive the number of turkeys that we have in past years.

We are asking our loyal supporters to consider donating funds to purchase turkeys or drop off a frozen turkey at our office in the coming weeks before Thanksgiving. We are currently experiencing an increase of 3-5 new applicants to the food distribution drive thru EACH DAY that we are open! We anticipate the need for turkeys to reach up to 300 this Thanksgiving. We have 64 turkeys in our freezer, and Thunder Valley has committed to donating 100. This means we are in need of approximately 150 turkeys, and ingredients for a nice meal! Gobble gobble!

We would like to thank our partners for continuing to support our Thanksgiving program. We are able to bless many families through their generosity.

- We have once again received a large donation of 100 turkeys from <u>Thunder Valley Casino</u>.
- The employees of <u>Thrivent</u> were very generous to donate sides for Thanksgiving meals!
- The youth group from the <u>Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints</u> will come to our warehouse before Thanksgiving and fill bags with ingredients to prepare a Thanksgiving feast. We are in need of these dinner items!


