DINING ROOM REOPENING!

St. Vincent de Paul Lunch Program

St. John's Episcopal serves at the St. Vincent Kitchen once every month. The program reaches out to the homeless and hungry in Roseville. We provide a hot meal of burritos, beans, and salad on the first Wednesday of each month. Our volunteers work in two teams, a cook team and a serving team.

Recently we were fortunate to be able to sit down with a couple of the guests at St. Vincent's, two men, Archer and John. They are very proud men living in their cars and on the streets for several years. Both men consider themselves fortunate to have cars to live in. They stated, "We don't leave a footprint where we go." When asked what the program meant to each of them, Archer replied, "It is a relief." John said it is "A lifeline." Archer said he heard about St. Vincent's through Kaiser Hospital when admitted there for health issues. John heard about the program through another homeless person. Both men were very grateful for the meals they received. Often times, the meal provided is the only meal they have each day.

On a day when St. John's was serving, a young man in his twenties came in with his family. His name was Alejandro. He asked if we were Christians. Then asked, "Will you pray for me?" He bowed his head. I touched his arm and let God speak. The young man had tears in his eyes and thanked us again. We cannot help but be touched by the many stories the guests of St. Vincent bring with them. They are all very thankful for St. Vincent's and the many volunteers who prepare and serve the food.

The St. Vincent Kitchen is run by John Mayne a man who when asked why he does this said, "It's not about me it's about them." We spoke also with the volunteers who were serving lunch that day and each said they have been serving St. Vincent's lunch program for a long time and will continue to serve as long as there is a need. When I asked what it meant to them, one woman replied. "My life is blessed. This is a way that I can give back."

A few Sundays ago, I (Tracy Falk, Board member) had the pleasure of visiting the reopened dining room.

What a treat to see it bustling with energy-volunteer cooks in the kitchen and clients sitting down and enjoying a hot meal prepared with love.

J.D., a client of 10 years said, "I appreciate the social experience eating at the Dining Room. People here are so kind and the food is great!". As clients left the room each of them turned to the cooks and thanked them, a simple gesture but it meant so much!

Since reopening the Dining Room has served 50-60 people each day, according to longtime manager, John Mayne. The need is there. Thank you all who support SVDP and the Dining Room!



CHRISTMAS STORE!



For two weeks in December, we once again opened our Christmas Store. Assisted by volunteer “elves”, over a hundred parents and grandparents, mostly regular clients, came in to shop for their children’s Christmas gifts. This year, the Christmas store’s selection and quantity of new, donated items was greater than ever. For the little boys and girls, there were dolls and animals, books and toys. For the big kids, parents got to choose from games, robots, art supplies, and athletic equipment. There were even some gift cards for the older hard-to-buy-for teens.



To help out the parents and grandparents, there was also a nice variety of wrapping paper, bags, tissue and bows. Christmas stockings and stocking stuffers rounded out the shopping experience. In all, over 200 local children got to wake up to a visit from Santa on Christmas morning.

Happy New Year to all of you! After wrapping up 2023, I look back with gratitude for your support in helping us in our mission to prevent hunger and homelessness. The past year put a strain on us, especially in our Food Locker. The number of households utilizing our Food Locker grew by 31% in 2023. Whereas we began the year helping around 60 households each day we were open, by the end of the year we often had well over 100 households coming in for food. In total, over 13,000 households utilized our Food Locker in 2023. It is due to all of you that we have been able to keep up.

During the pandemic we implemented a meal to go program in our Dining Room. I am happy to announce that we have recently reopened for in-person meals. Many thanks to St. John's Episcopal Church for their monthly work in the Dining Room and for allowing us to use an article they recently wrote for our newsletter.

The fall and holiday season is a busy time at St. Vincent's. I hope you enjoy reading about all of our activities this year, from participation in the City of Roseville's Turkey Trot, to our Turkey giveaway at Thanksgiving, to our Christmas Store, among other events.
